

The Bible Program Software Fee & Getting Started with Logos

The Logos 8 ABHE Essentials Library is required in multiple DCC Bible and theology courses. In fact, you will have only a few required textbooks for Bible and theology courses outside of those that appear in your ABHE Essentials Library. Dallas Christian College has reached an agreement with Faithlife, the makers of Logos Bible Software, to enable students to purchase the ABHE Essentials Library at a 50% discount. This reduces the financial impact to the student and may facilitate a student's use of financial aid funds to purchase the software, but at the Logos Academic Discount price.

How the Bible Program Software Fee Works

- An \$80 course fee is charged in each of the following courses: DCC 101 / 201, BIBL 1332 Old Testament Survey, BIBL 1331 New Testament Survey, and BIBL 2330 / 3301 Introduction to Biblical Research.
- The fee includes the cost of the Logos™ software purchased at the 50% Logos Academic Discount price plus a minimal administrative fee. (The administrative fee is far less than the Logos service fee charged for setting up a payment plan.)
- **You will receive an installation email from Logos at your CrusaderMail account (firstname.lastname@dcc.dallas.edu) with download instructions. It will come from FaithLife.com, Logos' parent company. Watch for it! Do not delete it!**
- **Your Logos login / username will be your CrusaderMail email address.**
- DCC students are encouraged to complete the application for the Logos Academic Discount Program at <https://www.logos.com/academic-discount>. (If, after you apply for the discount, you receive a call from an academic rep trying to sell you a library, politely decline stating that DCC is purchasing your library for you.)
- Students who already own a Logos Library may have the fee waived by demonstrating to Dr. Hahlen (Chair of the Bible Department) that they own a library sufficient for their DCC classes.

What You Get in Your Logos Library

- You get a library of well over 170 Bible study resources and features whose print value would approximate \$8,000. You can use and expand this library throughout your life.
- Logos resources (books) will be used as required textbooks in New Testament Survey, Old Testament Survey, Themes in Biblical Theology, Introduction to Biblical Research, and in multiple upper level Bible and theology electives.
- **Purchase of a Logos license gives you the right to load your Logos library on a personal computer, a work computer, an iPad or Android tablet, an iPhone, a Kindle Fire, and devices that you own. Download the free Logos Bible Software app from the appropriate app Store.**
- **Your Logos license allows you to use the Logos web app (app.logos.com) to access to your Logos library and Logos functions from any internet connected computer (e.g., library computer).**
- ***The two bullet points above translate to this: you do NOT need to own your own computer to use your Logos resources.***

Special Note: Because Logos does not sell site licenses, neither DCC nor any other school may legally and ethically provide a “library copy” of Logos to those who do not own a Logos license.

Logos Installation Instructions

The following reflect the content of the installation email you were sent by Faithlife, the parent company of Logos. If you have already used that email to install Logos successfully, you can skip this, but you may want to keep it in case you ever need to reinstall your library on a different computer.

- 1) **Account Credentials-** **Your new Logos account is associated specifically with your Crusader Mail email address.** This means you will need to use that email address to sign in and install the software.
 - a. *Password-* Before you can access Logos, you will need to create a password for your new account. Go to <https://www.logos.com/forgotpassword> and type in this email address. This will allow you to set up your password. Once completed, use the “Sign in” menu in the top right of logos.com to sign in and complete your user profile.
 - b. *Merging Accounts-* If you create or have an account under a different email address, that additional account will not have access to the resources in the school package. If you have additional accounts, Logos Customer Service can help by “merging” the accounts under one email address.
- 2) **Installing Logos on Your Computer-** Your new account gives you access to Logos for Windows or Mac. You can install Logos on multiple computers and devices. Before you attempt the installation, check the [system requirements](#). Please note that the initial installation process can be lengthy, but please allow Logos to complete the installation *before* using the software. Here are the steps:
 - a. Go to <https://www.logos.com/install>. Once you are signed in, you will find the “Files to Download” on this page. Click the download link “For Mac Users” or “For PC Users”. This will begin the initial download.
 - b. Once the installer file is downloaded, open the software and sign in with the same email and password as used in step 1. Signing in for the first time may take a few minutes. Please do not interrupt the process.
 - c. Once signed in, the configuration screen may allow you to select the number of books you prefer to download onto your hard drive. We recommend the “Everything” option so that you have access to all your Logos resources. Not all options will be available for every Logos package. It is recommended you take time to learn more about these options by clicking [here](#).
 - d. Next, you can select your preferred Bible, and allow the download to finish. After your resources have downloaded, Logos will automatically begin to [index](#) them for searching. Please note that large libraries can take hours to index. After indexing is complete, Logos will be completely configured and ready to use.
- 3) **Web App-** While you wait for the installation to complete, go to app.logos.com to use the Logos web app. Sign in with the same credentials, and you can instantly access your library and many of the top features of Logos. You can use this web app on any internet-connected computer by logging in to with your username and password.
- 4) **Mobile App-** Don’t forget to install the Logos [mobile app](#) on your phone or tablet.

- 5) Training- Logos provides you with many great training resources. The [Logos Student Training](#) has three short courses to help provide you with the skills you need to get started. You may also find the [Quickstart videos](#) and [Help Manual](#) beneficial. Additional training videos including mobile app training can be found [here](#).
- 6) Customer Service- There are times when our devices don't cooperate as expected and we need technical help. Logos has a great team available to help you troubleshoot and find a solution. 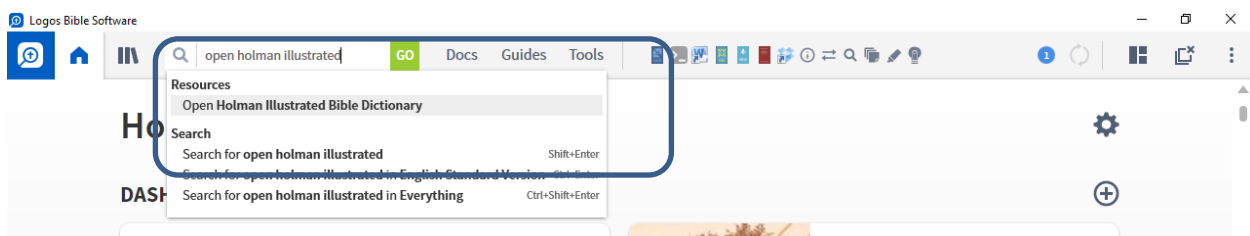
Getting Started with Your Logos Library

You will learn much of the functionality and special research functions of the Logos software in BIBL 2330 – Introduction to Biblical Research. Your use of the software in BIBL 1332 Old Testament Survey, BIBL 1331 New Testament Survey, and THEO 2310 Themes in Biblical Theology will be mainly to access assigned readings. Instructors in those courses will demonstrate various functions in the software, but you can start learning key processes in Logos by watching various short training videos found in the *QuickStart for Logos 8* within the Logos software itself. Instructions for how to open a book to a specific location and a list of suggested training videos to watch appear below.

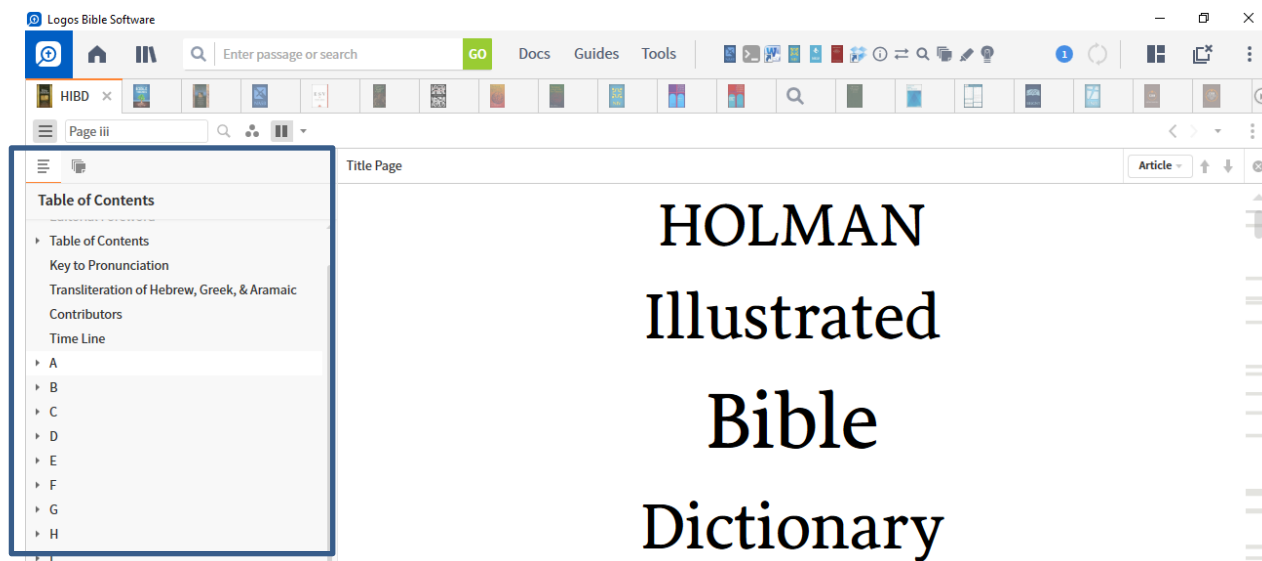
How to Open a Book in Logos

This is one of three methods. It will get you started. You will learn others in various classes and from training videos.

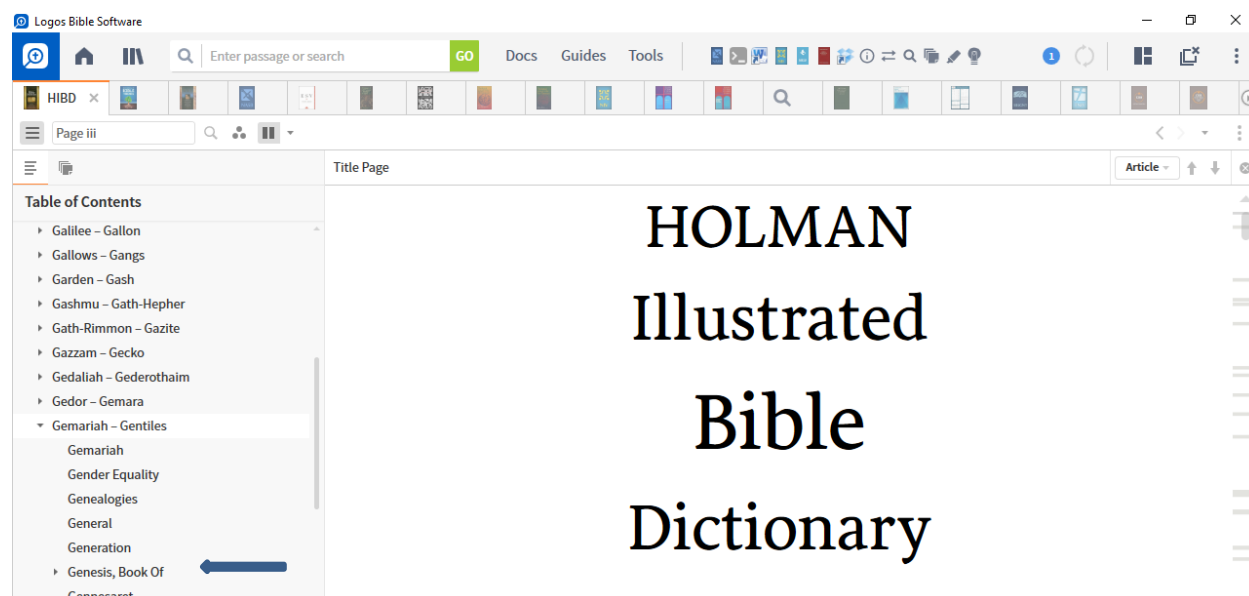
1. In the Go Box (top – toward the center), type “Open” (without the quotes) followed by the name of the book you want to open or the name of its author. A dropdown menu will appear. Click on the appropriate book from the list or click on “Go.”



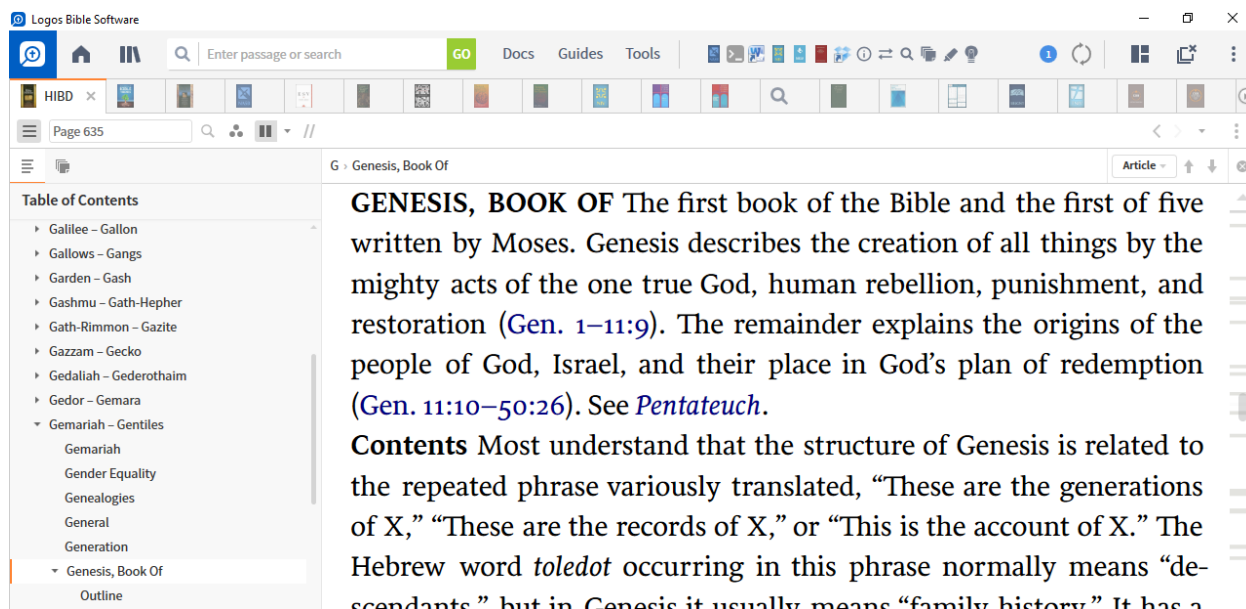
2. When the book opens, you will see the book's table of contents on the left side. (If it does not appear, type: Ctr + Shift + C)



3. In the table of contents column on the left, move your cursor down until you find the appropriate chapter or dictionary entry. Clicking on the triangles to the left of chapter / entry titles will open a dropdown menu that lists the sections within the chapter or entries within a dictionary section.



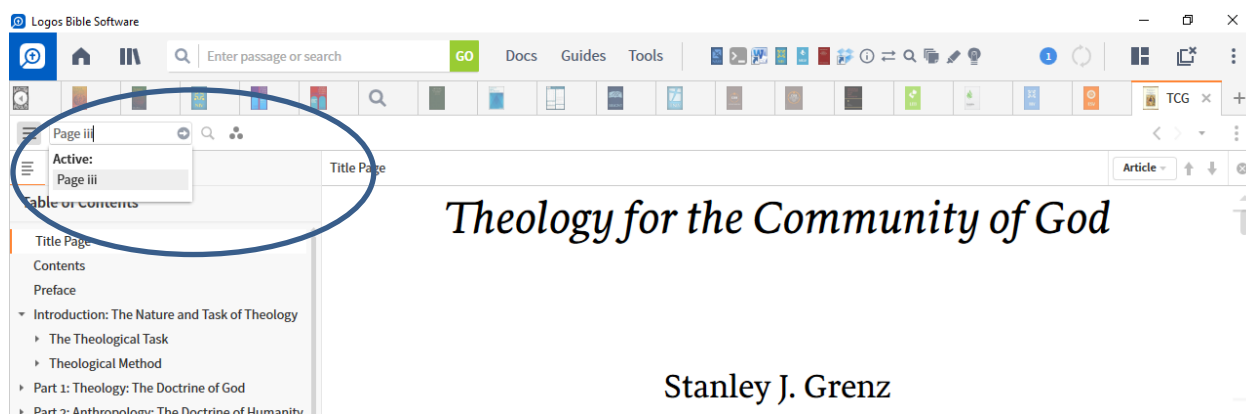
4. Left click on the appropriate chapter, section, or entry title. The appropriate chapter or section will open, and you can begin reading.



Opening a Logos Resource to a Specific Page

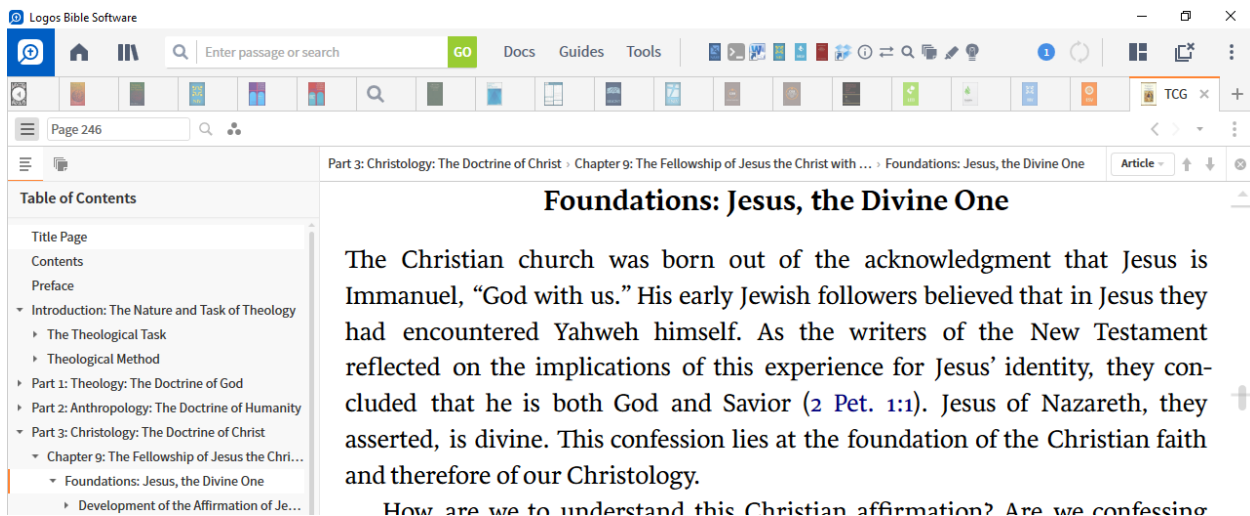
You may sometimes be assigned to read a specific sequence of pages from a book. Begin the process by opening the book using the method described in steps 1 and 2 above. Then...

3. Click on the Go box atop the table of contents column on the left side of the resource.



4. After "Page" in the Go box, type the first page number of your assigned / desired reading, and then click on the arrow to the right. The resource will open to the appropriate page.

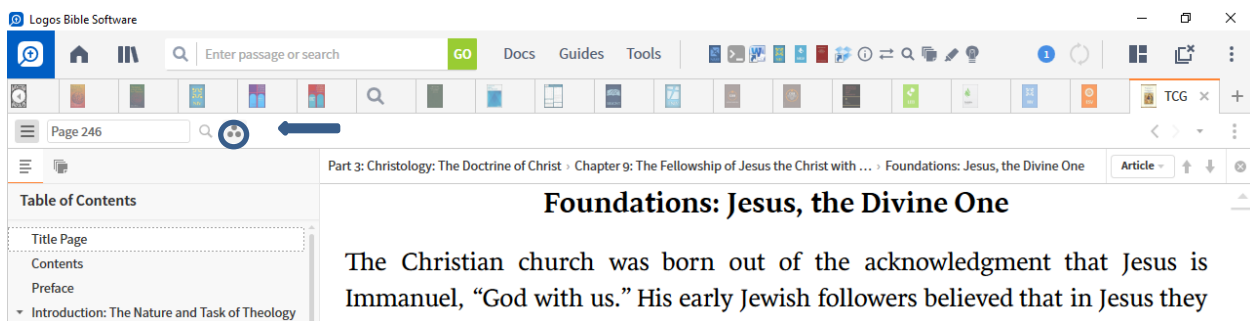




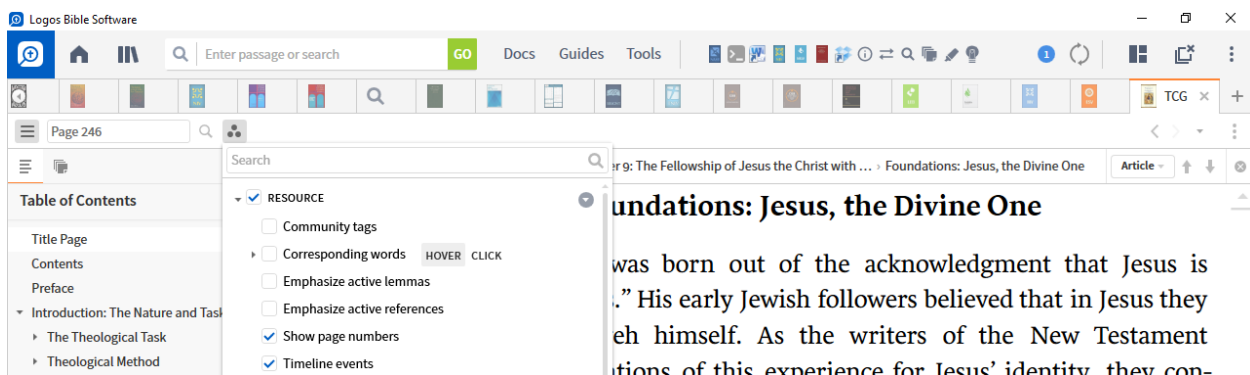
Showing Page Numbers in a Resource

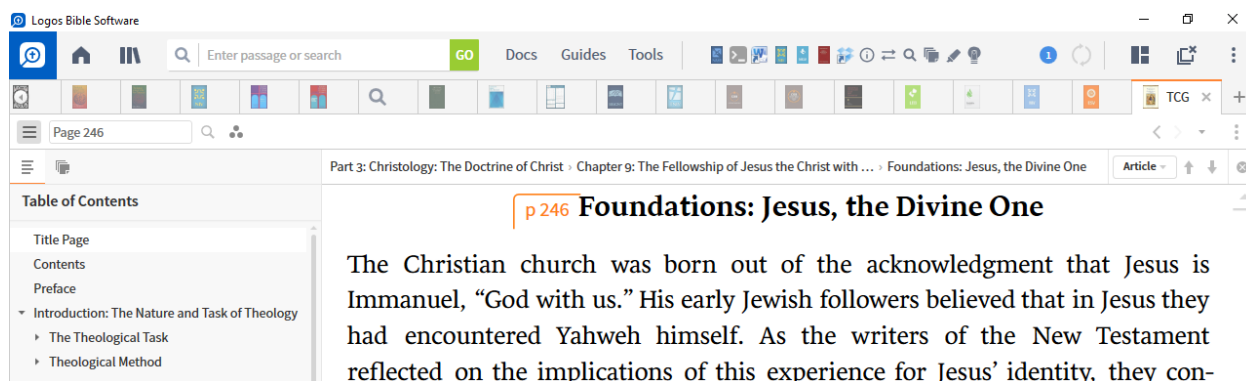
Most Logos resources allow you to show pagination. This is a valuable tool when writing research assignments.

1. With the resource open, click on the Visual Filters icon to the right of the resource Go box. (The icon is a set of dots arranged in a triangle.)



2. In the drop-down menu that appears, click on the “Resource” and “Show Page Numbers” boxes. Page numbers will now appear in the resource.
